



# CONGREGATION RODEPH SHALOM B'NAI MITZVAH TIMELINE

## The Bar/Bat Mitzvah Year

<b>9 months before</b>	Your family meets with Rabbi Maderer to discuss the Bar/Bat Mitzvah preparation process.*  Schedule weekly tutoring with RS tutors through Benay Stein.
<b>6 months before</b>	Your child will start his/her weekly tutoring with an RS tutor.
<b>6 weeks before</b>	Your child will meet with Cantor Frankel weekly (4 sessions) and will have 2 meetings with Rabbi Freedman to work on his/her d'var torah. These meetings are in person, at Rodeph Shalom, in the afterschool hours. Benay Stein will set up these meetings about 1-2 months prior.  Before your child begins seeing the clergy, please submit your RS bulletin form to Benay Stein. She will email this form to you in advance of the deadline.
<b>Saturday before</b>	Your family will serve as greeters at the Bar/Bat Mitzvah before your child's. Usually this is the week before, but the clergy office will inform you of the date - so please be sure to check your availability, and add that date to your calendar.
<b>Tuesday before</b>	Your child will have a final rehearsal in the sanctuary with Rabbi Maderer.
<b>Friday night before</b>	Your family will be honored at the Friday Night Shabbat service before your date. Your family will light the candles and lead kiddush.
<b>Bar/Bat Mitzvah Day</b>	It's your child's Bar or Bat Mitzvah Date! Mazel Tov! You will have a short rehearsal at 9:30am in the sanctuary, and will be ready to go by 10:30am. The service begins at 10:45am.
